The 2020 Census:

Every ten years a national Census of population is conducted. The 2020 Census will not only show us how our borough has changed over the last decade but will also play a significant role in shaping our future. Census data is used for a variety of important purposes, including planning for the needs of our community, distributing over \$600 billion in federal funding, and ensuring fair political representation. In March, every household in the United States will receive a notification about how to participate in the census. For the first time ever, you will be able to complete the census form online, by phone, or by mail. The 2020 Census form will contain only nine questions and should take less than ten minutes to complete. The confidentiality of all information you provide is strictly protected by federal law. 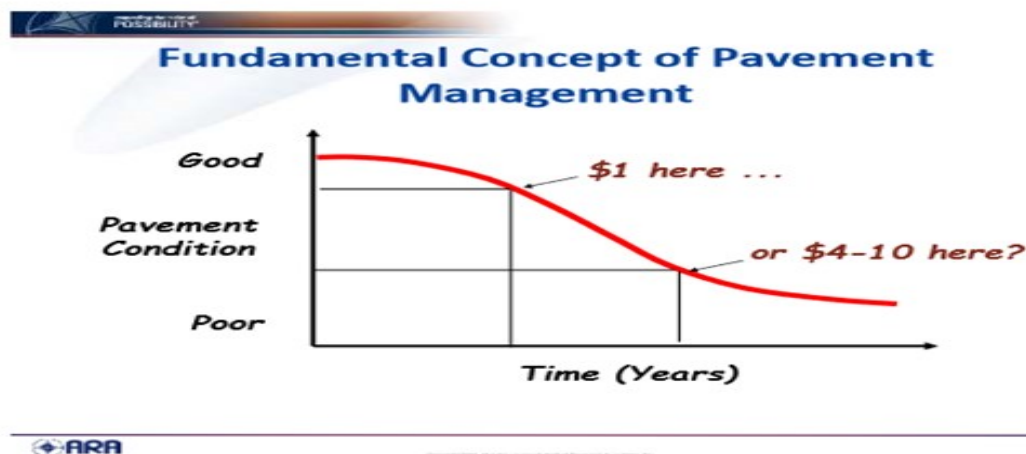

Fog Sealing Road Surfacing = Saving YOU money!

The Borough uses Fog Sealing surfacing because it costs about 10 times less than resurfacing with asphalt or concrete. Fog Sealing is used on lower-traveled and lower speed roads. Fog Sealing resurfacing is approved by PennDOT for these kinds of roadways. It typically takes about two days for the loose stones to become embedded in the road surface. Until then you may want to travel slower on that road. The oil and chip provide a protective wearing surface to prolong the road's service life. Then when the fog seal oil is applied it will help prevent any stone pick up, and seal it all together.



This process typically adds seven to ten years to the life of a road and will provide a safe, skid-resistant surface. The contractor applies only the amount of "chip" stone needed to minimize the "whip-off" of excess stone. The whole process has dramatically improved over the years with the better efficiency of techniques and equipment.





Household Hazardous Waste



Safely dispose of your household hazardous waste at the HHW facility, 1299 Harrisburg Pike, Lancaster, PA 17603 between Monday and Friday, 7:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. or Saturday 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. The following household items are accepted:

- ⇒ Adhesives
- ⇒ Automotive fluids (max. 5 gallons per container)
- ⇒ Batteries, including automotive and household
- ⇒ Chemistry sets
- ⇒ Cooking and frying oils (max. 5 gal. container)
- ⇒ Fire extinguishers
- ⇒ Floor and furniture polish
- ⇒ Fuel, including kerosene, gasoline and propane
- ⇒ Household Cleaners
- ⇒ Iodine
- ⇒ Lawn treatments, including herbicides and pesticides
- ⇒ Mercury containing items (max of 30 per month), including ballasts, fluorescent bulbs, thermostats and thermometers
- ⇒ Paint, rust inhibitors, stains, turpentine and thinners
- ⇒ Photographic and pool chemicals

A total of 10 e-waste items will be collected per day at the HHW facility:

- ⇒ Desktop computers
- ⇒ Laptops
- ⇒ Monitors
- ⇒ Computer peripherals, including a keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers
- ⇒ Televisions
- ⇒ E-readers
- ⇒ Cameras: photo and video
- ⇒ Cell phones, smart phones and peripherals: chargers, batteries, Bluetooth earpieces, air cards, clips, cases
- ⇒ DVD and VCR players
- ⇒ MP3 players and iPod's
- ⇒ PDA's
- ⇒ Portable electronic game players and video game consoles
- ⇒ Stereos and peripherals: CD players, turntables, amplifiers, speakers (no wooden materials)

All electronics must be intact or will not be accepted.



Household Hazardous Waste (Continued)

The following items are accepted from small businesses at the HHW facility (they do not accept items from institutions, industries, or manufacturers):

- ⇒ Batteries
- ⇒ Covered devices (see electronic waste on previous page)
- ⇒ Fluorescent bulbs (max of 30 per month)

Please note:

Empty containers, from paint and other items that previously contained liquids, are not accepted and can be disposed of as regular trash.

Another way for residents to dispose of old batteries is by using a Battery Bag (these are available at the Borough office). Once full, place the battery bag next to your trash can. Your garbage hauler will bring it to LCSWMA. Or, you can bring your batteries to the Borough office. You can also drop off old cell phones, ink cartridges and unwanted eye glasses at the Borough office.

2020 Summer Playground Program Early Registration begins April 1st

The Summer Playground program will celebrate it's 42nd year this summer. This program that is run by Hempfield recCenter will continue to encourages kids to **discover** the outdoors, to engage with friends and to remain active during summer vacation.

The eight-week, five-day program offers outdoor play, organized games, sports, and *optional* pool parties and field trips. With one flat fee for the entirety of the eight-week program, it's an affordable way to guarantee your child is supervised, safe and having fun while you are at work, running errands or simply in need of some me time.

Youth members of Hempfield recCenter receive the greatest discount at \$135 while residents of Hempfield School District pay \$155. The rate for non-residents is set at \$190.

Open to youth ages 6-13, the program is held Monday through Friday, 9:00 am until 3:30 pm from June 15th through August 7th. There is no maximum or minimum attendance required.

Registrations for Summer Playground opens Wednesday, April 1st and must be completed in-person, mailed or faxed to Hempfield recCenter, 950 Church St, Landisville (no phone calls, please). Early registration ends May 22nd. Registration received after May 22nd will be charged an additional \$10.

REMOVE all valuables

NEVER leave your vehicle running unattended

INSTALL a locking fuel cap

INSTALL a vehicle tracking system

INSTALL an ignition or fuel cut-off switch

PARK in well-lit locations; avoid isolated areas
