## What to do with Leaves during Fall Cleanup

Fall foliage can be very pretty, but can also cause problems if the leaves are not collected and disposed of properly.

When leaves are raked or blown into the street, storm drains can become clogged.

During heavy rains, blocked storm drains can cause flooding.

As we know leaves and grass clippings that make their way to local streams and rivers release nutrients that contribute to the accelerated growth of algae. This can be harmful to fish and other aquatic wildlife.

By taking the following steps, you can reduce the threat of flooding, and nutrient loading to local waterbodies.

- **Mulch:** An easy and beneficial way to deal with leaves is by mulching them back onto your lawn. Simply mow the leaves and leave them on the lawn. The mower will chop the leaves into small pieces that will decompose and provide valuable nutrients to the soil.
- **Compost:** Add Fallen leaves to a compost pile or place them in planting beds or gardens to provide an inexpensive and nutrient rich fertilizer for your garden. Composting is nature's truest form of recycling.
- **Rake:** After raking, place leaves into yard waste/leaf bags and place at curb on leaf pick-up dates: October 31, November 14, November 29, December 12.
- \*Leaves should never be placed in the storm drain, gutter or street.
- \*Leaf bags should not be put out more than 24 hours prior to pick up.

## Resident Disposal Checklist





## Determine the material type, so you know where to take it:

- Recycling: We accept the Big 4 at our dropoff containers, which includes 1) corrugated cardboard, 2) plastics with necks, 3) metal food and beverage cans, and 4) glass bottles and jars. Any illegal dumping will be prosecuted.
- Household Hazardous Waste (HHW): We accept household chemicals, batteries, televisions, computers, and related items ONLY at our HHW Facility. Please visit our

website for a complete list of materials.

Trash: We accept all forms of household trash, large items, appliances, and tires. See the list below for special instructions related to certain types of waste.



## Determine if you have waste that needs special handling:

- Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) materials, including televisions and computers, must be taken to the HHW Facility on Harrisburg Pike in Lancaster.
- Asbestos must be delivered directly to the Frey Farm Landfill. Please contact LCSWMA to make arrangements for delivery and disposal.
- Yard Waste is only accepted at the Frey Farm Landfill in Conestoga.
- Sharps must be stored in container (ex: Safe Clip or detergent bottle) and sealed to protect workers. Dispose in your regular trash.



## Determine which site to deliver the material:

All LCSWMA facilities accept recycling, trash, remodeling/construction material, appliances, tires, and large items.

- Household Hazardous Waste Facility 1299 Harrisburg Pike, Lancaster Lancaster County residents only
- Transfer Station Complex 1299 Harrisburg Pike, Lancaster
- Lancaster Waste-to-Energy Facility 1911 River Road, Bainbridge
- Frey Farm Landfill 3049 River Road, Conestoga
- Susquehanna Resource Management Complex 1670 South 19th Street, Harrisburg



## Other considerations

- Have you verified the operating hours? Each facility offers different hours. Additionally, due to large projects and holidays, times may vary, so it's important to confirm ahead of your visit (717–397–9968 or www.lcswma.org).
- Do you have proper payment ready?

  We accept ONLY credit cards and prepaid cards, not cash or checks.
- Is your truck or trailer tarped?
- Are you prepared to unload your material?
- Are you wearing proper footwear and attire to unload your material? We recommend closed toed shoes and proper clothing to protect yourself during the unloading process.


## East Petersburg Borough Community Park Renovations Project Update: The project is now in progress and the park is under construction!!

When attending events, meeting at the community center or hanging out at the park, please use caution.

The old sidewalks on the park side have been removed, therefore you will need to enter from the parking lot side. Please be aware of construction equipment and vehicles. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this construction period.

This project will rehabilitate the park playground equipment, restrooms, and construct an ADA compliant pathway that interconnects the recreation area. The unsafe wooden playground equipment is being replaced with upgraded playground equipment that will be ADA-compliant.

Sidewalks are being installed to connect the pathway to the parking lot, and bathroom facilities will be expanded to include a new ADA-restroom facility that is accessible for all park goers. This project was made possible through a DCNR Playground and Recreation Grant.

## SPECIAL NEEDS REGISTRY

The East Petersburg Borough Special Needs Registry, a voluntary program designed to enhance the safety and well-being of residents during emergencies. This registry allows individuals or their caregivers to provide critical information to local emergency personnel about medical conditions, mobility limitations, communication challenges, or other special circumsta`nces that could impact emergency response. By enrolling in this confidential registry, you help our first responders better plan for and respond to the needs of our community during disasters or other emergencies.

## A few highlights of note:

- · Participation is entirely voluntary and free of charge.
- Information is kept strictly confidential and only accessed by the fire department during an emergency.
- Residents can update or remove their information at any time by using an opt-out form on the East Petersburg Borough Website or a paper form at the Borough Office.

Registration does not guarantee rescue, evacuation, or emergency services during a disaster. The registry is a tool to support planning efforts. All residents, whether enrolled in the registry or not, should continue to maintain a personal emergency plan, secure necessary supplies, and identify alternate sources of support.

Registration forms are available virtually on the East Petersburg Borough website or in print at the East Petersburg Borough Office. Thank you for helping us build a more resilient community!

## SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Here are a few ideas for observing National Preparedness Month and get prepared for notifications!

- Sign up for local emergency alerts through your county or city's notification system.
- Enable Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) on your cell phone.
- Download weather and emergency apps like FEMA, Red Cross, or your local emergency management app.
- Follow Lancaster County Department of Public Safety and other agencies on social media for real-time updates (e.g., local emergency management, National Weather Service).
- Listen to NOAA Weather Radio for severe weather warnings.
- Keep a battery-powered or hand-crank radio in your emergency kit.

## BACK-TO-SCHOOL: FAMILY EMERGENCY PLANS

As the school year begins, it's the perfect time for parents and guardians to review and update their family's emergency plans. From making sure contact information is current to talking with kids about safety procedures, a few simple steps now can help ensure children are protected and prepared if an emergency happens at school.

## **Keep Contact Info Current**

Make sure the school has up-to-date phone numbers, email addresses, and emergency contacts for you and any guardians.

## Know the School's Plan

Take time to understand the school's emergency procedures—lockdowns, evacuations, reunification sites—so you know what to expect.

## Share Health Information

Inform the school about any allergies, medical conditions, or medications your child needs. Make sure the nurse and any relevant staff have the details they need.

## Confirm Emergency Pick-Up List

Double-check that the school has a list of trusted adults who can pick up your child if you're not available.

## Talk Safety at Home

Have age-appropriate conversations with your child about what to do in different emergencies, from fire drills to lockdowns. Make sure they know who to call and where to go.

## Create a Family Communication Plan

Decide together how you'll reach each other during an emergency. Teach your child how to use a phone and agree on a safe meeting spot if they ever need to leave school grounds.

## **Check Medical Supplies**

If your child needs medication or specific supplies, confirm the school has what they need—and that nothing is expired.

## Pack a Mini Emergency Kit

Consider adding a small kit to your child's backpack with water, a snack, a flashlight, and a comfort item.

## Stay in the Loop

Pay attention to school safety updates and drills. Parent-teacher conferences and newsletters can be good opportunities to learn about emergency plans.

## **Review Transportation Safety**

If your child rides the bus or carpools, talk through safety rules and understand the school's procedures for transportation emergencies.
